**A RESOLUTION OF THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF WINDSOR
APPROVING AND CERTIFYING THE MARCH 2014 SEWER SYSTEM
MANAGEMENT PLAN (SSMP) UPDATE AS REQUIRED BY THE STATE WATER
RESOURCES CONTROL BOARD ORDER 2006-0003-DWQ "SANITARY SEWER
SYSTEM WASTE DISCHARGE REQUIREMENTS" AND
AUTHORIZING THE TOWN MANAGER TO CERTIFY FUTURE NON-
CONSEQUENTIAL SSMP CHANGES**

WHEREAS, on May 2, 2006, the State Water Resources Control Board (SWRCB) issued Order No. 2006-0003-DWQ "Sanitary Sewer System Waste Discharge Requirements" (SSS WDR); and

WHEREAS, the purpose of the SSS WDR is to develop a regulatory mechanism to provide a consistent statewide approach for reducing sanitary sewer overflows (SSOs); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the statewide SSS WDR, public agencies that own and operate sanitary sewer systems greater than one mile in length were required to develop an SSMP in accordance with Order No. 2006-0003-DWQ requirements and present it to the agency's governing board for approval at a public meeting; and

WHEREAS, the Town of Windsor developed an SSMP based on the SSS WDR requirements, certified its various elements and the Town Council approved the SSMP and its implementation on July 15, 2009; and

WHEREAS, the SSS WDR requires that the SSMP be updated every five (5) years, that the update include any significant program changes, and that re-certification by the governing board is required when significant updates to the SSMP are made; and

WHEREAS, on July 30, 2013 the SWRCB amended the Monitoring and Reporting Program for the SSS WDR (SWRCB Order No. WQ 2013-0058 EXEC); and

WHEREAS, the March 2014 SSMP update constitutes a significant revision that requires approval and re-certification by the governing Board.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Town Council of the Town of Windsor hereby approves and certifies the March 2014 SSMP update and its implementation, and directs the Town Manager to periodically update the SSMP as necessary to reflect current regulatory requirements and best practices.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Town Manager or her designee is hereby authorized and directed to certify future non-consequential SSMP changes with the State Water Resources Control Board.
