

COPE Neighborhood Leaders



The gathering of neighbors, to understand their risks and work together to minimize the disruption to their community can change the way disasters effect their families. Meeting neighbors and sharing expertise, knowledge, and critical needs with those who are in the best position to help in a disaster is the essence of community. By working together, you are better prepared, especially when first responders may not be able to meet the demands for services due to the scope of the disaster.

The role of the COPE Neighborhood Leader is to provide COPE program guidance and emergency preparedness information to their neighborhood team, 10 to 20 residences. In this role, they represent their neighborhood within the COPE community and serve as a point person to their COPE Community Leader and local first responders, as needed. They are encouraged to have at least one Co-Neighborhood Leader to assist them.
