

RESOLUTION NO. 3759-22

**A RESOLUTION OF THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF WINDSOR
AUTHORIZING THE SUBMITTAL OF A LIST OF PROJECTS FOR FISCAL YEAR
2022-23 FUNDED BY SENATE BILL 1: THE ROAD REPAIR AND
ACCOUNTABILITY ACT OF 2017**

WHEREAS, Senate Bill 1 (SB 1), the Road Repair and Accountability Act of 2017 (Chapter 5, Statutes of 2017) was passed by the Legislature and signed into law by the Governor in April 2017 to address the significant multi-modal transportation funding shortfalls statewide; and

WHEREAS, SB 1 includes accountability and transparency provisions that will ensure the residents of the Town of Windsor (Town) are aware of the projects proposed for funding in our community and which projects have been completed each fiscal year; and

WHEREAS, the Town must adopt by resolution a list of projects proposed to receive fiscal year funding from the Road Maintenance and Rehabilitation Account (RMRA), created by SB 1, which must include a description and the location of each proposed project, a proposed schedule for the project's completion, and the estimated useful life of the improvement; and

WHEREAS, the Town will receive an estimated \$634,945 in RMRA funding in Fiscal Year 2022-23 from SB 1; and

WHEREAS, this is the sixth year in which the Town is receiving SB 1 funding and will enable the Town to continue essential road maintenance and rehabilitation projects, safety improvements, repairing and replacing aging bridges, and increasing access and mobility options for the traveling public that would not have otherwise been possible without SB 1; and

WHEREAS, the Town used a Pavement Management System to develop the SB 1 project list to ensure revenues are being used on the most high-priority and cost-effective projects that also meet the community's priorities for transportation investment; and

WHEREAS, the funding from SB 1 will help the Town maintain and rehabilitate 17 streets with approximately 86,000 square yards of street surface this year; and

WHEREAS, the 2020 California Statewide Local Streets and Roads Needs Assessment found that the Town's streets and roads are in good condition and this revenue will help increase the overall quality of the Town's road system and over the next decade will bring the Town's streets and roads into an excellent condition; and

WHEREAS, the SB 1 project list and overall investment in the Town's local streets and road infrastructure with a focus on basic maintenance and safety, investing in complete streets infrastructure, and using cutting-edge technology, materials and practices will have significant positive co-benefits statewide.


NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the foregoing recitals are true and correct; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the following previously proposed and adopted project may also utilize Fiscal Year 2022-23 Road Maintenance and Rehabilitation Account revenues in its delivery. With the relisting of this project in the adopted fiscal year resolution, the Town is reaffirming to the public and the State our intent to fund these projects with Road Maintenance and Rehabilitation Account revenues: The remaining portion of the 2021-22 Town-Wide Street Resurfacing Project will resurface existing pavement with an asphalt-rubber cape seal, which consists of a first layer of asphalt-rubber chip seal and a second layer of microsurfacing to provide a smooth surface. Streets to be resurfaced include Lea Street, Tamara Way, Shira Street, Pleasant Avenue, 3rd Street, Berry Lane, Hembree Lane south of Old Redwood Highway, and Starr Road north of Windsor River Road. The new cape seal will have an estimated useful life of ten years. Construction of the proposed project is expected to begin in June 2022 and be completed by August 2022; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Council of the Town of Windsor authorizes the submittal of a list of projects for Fiscal Year 2022-23 funded by Senate Bill 1: The Road Repair and Accountability Act of 2017.
